In the recycling process, plastic waste is shredded, washed, dried, and in most cases, re-melted into plastic pellets that are sold for the production of new plastic products both domestically and abroad. Sorpa	Municipalities in the capital area	The regional association SORPA is owned by six municipalities: Reykjavík, Kópavogur, Hafnarfjörður, Garðabær, Mosfellsbær, and Seltjarnarnes. SORPA's role is to handle waste management and thereby fulfill the statutory duty of the municipalities. This involves operating a reception and sorting station, a landfill site, a gas and composting plant, and six recycling centers, which are operated under service agreements with the municipalities. SORPA also oversees local collection containers on behalf of the municipalities and operates the second-hand markets Góði hirðirinn and Efnismiðlun Góða hirðisins. Terra		Terra places great emphasis on making it easier for Icelanders to leave nothing behind; to reuse, sort, and responsibly manage recyclable materials and other waste. 'Leave nothing behind' is a translation of Zero Waste, which is an international initiative aimed at improving the way we interact with the Earth by reducing pollution and waste. Bergplast		For nearly three decades, Bergplast has produced Icelandic recyclable plastic packaging. All waste generated during production is 100% recyclable. Bergplast can produce various products from recycled plastic, including for the construction industry, most notably corner guards and snow melting clips. The packaging produced by Bergplast can have a continued life, but only if returned to recycling centers. Therefore, Bergplast has initiated a collaboration with Sorpa, which has installed bins at Sorpa's recycling centers where packaging can be returned for recycling. Endurvinnslan	Several companies and the government	<p>Endurvinnslan hf. was established in 1989, according to law no. 52/1989. The reason for the establishment of the company was nature and environmental protection, although there were hopes that it would be possible to recycle the packaging, which gradually became a reality.</p> <p>Endurvinnslan, along with its agents, handles the reception of all disposable beverage containers in the country, pays out deposit refunds, prepares them for export, and sells them for recycling. Molta	All municipalities in Eyjafjörður, as owners of Flokkunar ehf., all the largest food producers in the Eyjafjörður area, and other stakeholders	<p>The company Molta ehf was founded in March 2007. All municipalities in Eyjafjörður, as owners of Flokkunar ehf., all the largest food producers in the Eyjafjörður area, and other stakeholders participated in the establishment. An agreement was made with the Finnish company Preseco Oy to purchase equipment for the plant, and Preseco is also a shareholder in Molta. Trial production began nearly a year after the groundbreaking, and the plant was officially inaugurated on August 21, 2009.
